KS4 provide overview of what is studied at KS4

In year 10, pupils work through a controlled assessment task that consists of a portfolio of work which allows pupils to develop their ICT skills in word processing software, desk top publishing, presentation software, spreadsheet software and database software. Topics studied include applications software, the Internet and emerging technologies.

In year 11 pupils develop a web site using multimedia software. Topics studied include networks, human computer interfaces, the social and environmental impact of ICT and legal and ethical issues about using information technology.
